Music is recognised as a universal language and an essential part of a broad and balanced curriculum.

We are committed to providing high-quality musical experiences for all pupils, ensuring access to a wide range of genres, styles and cultural traditions. Through a consistent approach, including the use of a structured scheme and opportunities to work with specialist teachers and external providers, pupils are supported to develop their musical skills and appreciation over time.

Through high-quality teaching, we develop the following essential characteristics in our pupils:

- A love and appreciation of music across a range of genres, styles and traditions;
- Confidence in performing, both individually and as part of a group;
- The ability to compose, improvise and express ideas creatively through music;
- Developing listening skills, including attention to detail and recall of musical sounds;
- An understanding of how music is created, produced and communicated, including key musical elements;
- Growing independence and resilience through rehearsal, performance and critique;
- An appreciation of the cultural and historical significance of music.

Our music curriculum is underpinned by the National Curriculum and reflects our commitment to providing a broad and balanced education. It is further enriched through wider opportunities, including instrumental tuition, performance experiences and engagement with external organisations, supporting pupils to develop a lifelong appreciation of music.
